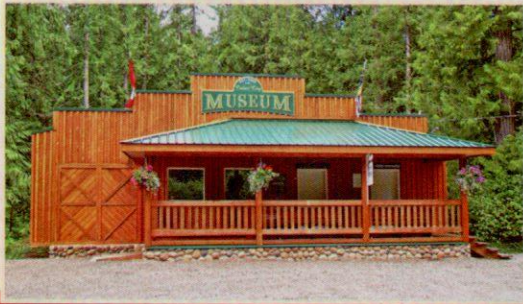


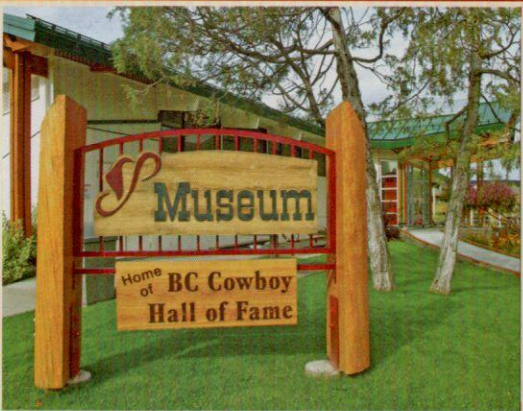

Jack Lynn Museum in Horsefly



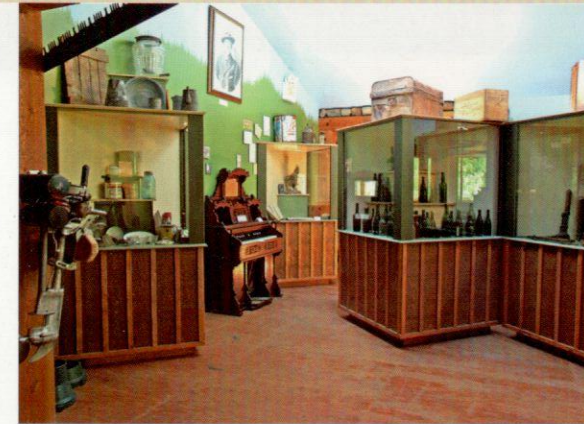

Cedar City Museum: Gold Rush Boom Towns, Mining and Logging

Cedar City Museum and Info Centre is located in Cedar Point (Class C) Provincial Park, an hour and fifteen minutes from Williams Lake. Two main display rooms have interactive exhibits. An old time theatre has looping videos and a gift shop is included in the Info Centre.

This museum features artifacts and photographs from Cedar City, Keithley and Quesnel Forks gold rush boom towns to more recent hydraulic mining operations and logging ventures in Likely.

Cedar City was officially opened by Lt. Governor, Iona Campagnolo on May 17, 2007, and is open 7 days a week from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. during July and August or by appointment after hours and during the off season.



Jack Lynn Museum: Pioneers, Mining and Early Ranching



Centrally located in downtown Horsefly, just 45 minutes from 150 Mile House, the Jack Lynn Museum features a collection of buildings, including the oldest standing structure in Horsefly, built by a Norwegian immigrant in 1902. Artifacts relate to early mining, ranching, farming and homesteading. Archives of photographs, early school records and an extensive oral history tape collection are available for research. The grounds contain a convenient picnic area amongst many interesting pieces of equipment used in early mining and the pioneer era.

This museum is open from June 15th to Sept 15th daily from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., or by appointment.

Museum of the Cariboo Chilcotin: Ranching, Rodeo and Town History

Situated on the corner of Borland and North 4th Avenue this museum is a tribute to the cowboy, housing the prestigious BC Cowboy Hall of Fame. Special exhibits include photos, videos, artifacts and written accounts of ranching, with extensive historical information on Williams Lake, Forestry, the famous stampede and native crafts and tools. The gift shop offers western art, books and videos with a special focus on western poets and musicians. Archival collections are open to the public for research.

The Museum of the Cariboo Chilcotin is open from June to August, Monday to Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and from September to May, Tuesday to Saturday, 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Admission is \$2.00 for adults. Children under 12 are admitted for free.
